Year 12 End of Year Exams

As we enter the second half of the Summer term, I wanted to inform you of arrangements for the Year 12 end of year exams, and the support students are being provided with in preparation for these.

Exams:

The end of year exams will take place between Friday 21 June and Thursday 27 June (inclusive).

I would like to emphasise the importance of these exams for our students for a number of reasons:

- (i) They indicate a readiness for Year 13 study, both in terms of attainment levels and independent study skills.
- (ii) They form a large (but not total) part of the basis for predicted grades for final A level.
- (iii) They form a part of determining predicted grades for UCAS applications.
- (iv) They demonstrate progress (or otherwise) in relation to the mid-term exams which took place in March.

It is crucial that students prepare adequately for the end of year exams. Exam timetables will be emailed directly to students. The exam timetable is attached to the bottom of this letter, along with an overview of what students will be assessed on for each subject. Please note that during the examination period, students will be on study leave. Regular lessons will resume from Friday 28 June. Examination results will be distributed on Tuesday 9 July.

Following the exams, students will receive feedback from learning areas and have the opportunity to discuss their results and overall progress with a member of the Sixth Form team. Students who have not performed as predicted will have a meeting with a senior member of staff to discuss their programme for Year 13.

PD Time

Significant work has gone in to revamping Personal Development time this year to ensure it is age appropriate and beneficial for Sixth Form students. This has included work on the transition to Sixth Form, study skills, and key celebration events and current affairs. The period up to and including exams will have a collapsed Personal Development timetable with students given half an hour each morning to study independently and prepare for their day. Each student will also receive a scheduled one-to-one meeting with their tutor.

A key focus of personal development this year has been the effective use of study periods. The average Sixth Form student has around 10 study periods per week, and students are encouraged to consistently use these to their advantage, and to help minimise the pressures on them outside of the school day. In addition, the Sixth Form is open and staffed from 8.00am until 4.30pm.

While the end of year exams are important student wellbeing remains a key priority. Miss Hodgson is running two exam preparation sessions in week commencing 10 June, including key strategies for coping with the increased stress around exams, as part of our ongoing support for students through their Sixth Form studies.

Code of Conduct:

Thank you for your ongoing support in maintaining high attendance within Sixth Form. Attendance of over 90% is a really important factor in ensuring students gain the qualifications they need for their next steps. You will also have received information regarding our newly implemented Code of Conduct which was introduced to students last week. Students have been asked to sign the copy they were given and to also have it signed by yourselves. This represents a key element of our professional standards within the Sixth Form, and while it does not cover anything we do not already expect from our students, formalising these expectations is an important step as we prepare them for success in their Year 13 exams and their progression into the wider world.
